

Guaranteed Residence.

Lay the Groundwork for Your Career Before You Graduate

Gain competitive industry experience and build your resumé by applying what you learn in the classroom with hands-on practical experience.

In the Classroom/Lab

Research at York (RAY) program: Participate in university research projects with faculty members and peers while earning a competitive wage. Previous opportunities have included behavioural coding and transcript analysis for psychotherapy research, collecting data on stars in the York University Observatory and classifying materials at the Archives of Ontario.

In the Community

Work with a local community partner to conduct research, engage in community service or manage an off-campus project. Psychology students have worked with community partners, such as the Centre for Addiction & Mental Health, to address needs in health and social psychology.

Work/Study program: Benefit from part-time, on-campus employment opportunities that enable eligible undergraduate student employees to contribute to the York community while gaining valuable experiential on-the-job training, as well as guidance and mentorship from staff, faculty and peers.

Leadership, Engagement and Ambassadorship Program (LEAP): Enhance your student experience with paid, part-time employment that allows eligible undergraduate students to develop skills such as leadership, peer mentoring and peer support within the University setting while learning about the school as a whole.

Becoming YU: Work/Study or LEAP positions are also a part of Becoming YU – a program that supports you in setting goals, identifying skills you want to develop as well as reflecting on, and articulating, your experiences with a dedicated coach.

Work/Study, RAY and LEAP opportunities are posted on the Experience York website. Once you are a registered student, you will need to fill out the Student Financial Profile to apply for them.

Pathways to Masters Programs

Schulich School of Business Master of Management Program

Our Pathway to Master of Management Program (PMMP) offers qualified students the opportunity to join the 4+1 program, which entails four years of non-business undergraduate study followed by a one-year Master of Management (MMgt) program at Schulich. Take advantage of an early and simplified application process to the MMgt program. Upon successfully completing your four-year undergraduate program and meeting the entry requirements, you will begin your MMgt program.

Glendon Master's in Public & International Affairs

The Political Science Department and the Master's in Public & International Affairs have put in place a new 3+2 program that will allow the best undergraduate political science students to access the MPIA after their third year of study, and then complete their BA and the MPIA in five years instead of six.

Your York reference number (provided when you applied for admission) is required to complete the online form. Apply early – you don't need to wait for an offer of admission.

Apply For OSAP

OSAP provides eligible applicants with loans and non-repayable government grants to assist you in paying your tuition. Use the OSAP aid estimator on the OSAP website to see how much government aid could be available to you. Submit your OSAP application and all required documents online through the OSAP webpage before **June 30** to ensure your funding is available at the start of the Fall term.



3 Submit required documents


